1.1 SAFETY & ENVIRONMENT MOMENT

R Drummond outlined the CalMac process for investigation of incidents, including that the reports went to the HSEQ Committee for review. He gave the Board an overview of the recent incident when the MV Caledonian Isles had hit the quayside due to a combination of low tide and pier infrastructure and had required repairs to a pierced hull.

R Drummond detailed the current safety issues with the Ardrossan harbour berth and confirmed that making the necessary repairs and ensuring the safety of the berth was the responsibility of the harbour authority, Peel Ports. In the meantime CalMac were not using the main berth and instead using the Irish Berth at Ardrossan or Gourock which had reduced the number of sailings. He confirmed that there had been communications from CalMac on this issue and some negative press had been received although it was a Peel Ports responsibility and CalMac was merely the user of the berth.
